Robert M. Silver, MD is a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Utah Health Sciences Center. He is Interim Chair of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Chief of the Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine and Co-Director of Labor and Delivery at the University Health sciences Center. Dr. Silver's clinical and research interests include recurrent pregnancy loss and stillbirth, cesarean delivery, placenta accreta, vaginal birth after cesarean delivery, immunologic diseases in pregnancy, and medical disorders in pregnancy. He is the co-PI of the Utah site for the MFMU and is the PI for the NuMoM2b Network, the Heart Health study, the Stillbirth

Collaborative Research Network and the EAGeR trial. He is also active in the Society for Maternal Fetal Medicine and the International Stillbirth Alliance.
